
Compreflex Contain Full Leg Wrap Patient Profile

Ideal for Active and Maintenance Stages of:

- Lymphedema (advance stages)
- Edema
- Lipedema

Product selection

- Contain Calf, Thigh, and Full Leg are billable under multiple HCPCS codes
- Patients benefit from more containment in an inelastic wrap
- Designed with a moderately-contoured calf shape to fit edematous legs
- Patient requires a compressive liner with 10-15mmHg in the foot and ankle
- · Ability to wear standard footwear over liner is desired





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



Indications

Lymphedema, Edema, Lipedema

Absolute Contraindications

Severe cardiac insufficiency (NYHA III-IV); Phlegmasia cerulea dolens; Severe PAOD with any of the following: ABPI <0.6; ankle pressure <60mmHg; toe pressure <30mmHg; Severe diabetic neuropathy with sensory loss or microangiopathy with the risk of skin necrosis; Compression of an existing arterial bypass; Allergic to compression material

Precautions

Special precautions must be taken, if the use of compression garments is considered in patients with borderline indications such as:

PAOD with ABPI >0.6 - <0.9 and/or ankle pressure between 60 and 90mmHg; Patients with compensated heart failure (NYHA I-II) and venous or lymphatic edema; Diabetes mellitus; Skin diseases with exudation or mixed arterio-venous ulcer; Compression garments for the reduction of inflammation; pain or edema of the leg, erysipelas or cellulitis should only be used in combination with antibacterial treatment; Skin irritations in sensitive patients can be prevented by applying applicable skin care beneath compression garment; Liners and wraps should not be worn directly on wounds

Treatment decisions should be taken on a case-by-case basis and under consideration of a careful benefit-risk assessment. All serious incidents that occur when using the product should be reported to the manufacturer and the competent supervisory authority.

Garment Care

Machine wash on gentle cycle using a mild detergent; DO NOT use bleach or fabric softeners; Tumble dry on low heat setting. Air drying is recommended to preserve the life of the garment. <u>Frequency of garment removal for laundering, skin checks, and hygiene may vary</u> <u>according to each individual's needs and the prescribing provider's recommendations.</u>

Compreflex Contain Full Leg Wrap Product Development – External Wear Test

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- 10/10 participants have responded . and all have a diagnosis of stage II lymphedema
 - 88% of participants opted to not ٠ wear the hip attachment
 - 67% of participants noted the ٠ garment required re-adjusting throughout the day

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From A Therapist's Perspective Shape Overview

Great Fit



- Leg size does not change much from foot to thigh
- Cylindrical shape
- Minimal lobules





- The angle between the ankle to thigh is growing
- Cup shaped
- Moderate lobules
- Shorter stature and may need only thigh or knee
- May require foam to improve fit, fill the gaps




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- The difference between the ankle and thigh is very large
- Cone shaped
- Large lobules and skin folds
- Outside of the size chart
- Requiring strap extenders on largest size
- May work well if they are sedentary or for night
- May require foam to improve the fit, fill the gaps; other products such as Reduce



Good Fit

Patient with shorter legs did not require all 3 pieces – used thigh and cut as a knee piece for best fit

Not Ideal Fit

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Slick undergarment – will cause Posterior View – no movement Side View – no movement Anterior View – post short walk sliding of about 50 feet

From A Therapist's Perspective Not a great fit







Not Ideal Fit







One Size Does Not Fit All Simple Customization

Patient Needs

- Has a shorter limb and needs a shorter than regular thigh piece but knee is not long enough
- Need more coverage on lateral thigh
- Don't want the garment rubbing in groin

Therapist Fears

- Anxious to cut a garment incorrectly
- How can I fit this odd shape?
- Can I return it?
- Will it stay up on my patient?
- What other options do I have for pairing this garment?
- Does my patient require this much containment?

A More Custom Fit Thigh piece customization



Roll garment to just below gluteal fold



Roll garment in front/groin to comfortable height



Trace under fold with a marker



Make sure marker line is visible and then remove for cutting

After cutting place back on patient and check for fit/comfort
